

Guidelines for Use of DHS Opportunity Fund

The Opportunity Fund is directed towards providing needy students with more opportunities to enrich their educational experiences and build firmer foundations for learning. Only Singapore citizens are eligible for the fund.

Access to ICT – Tapping on the NEU PC Plus Programme by IMDA

The NEU PC Plus Programme, by the Infocomm Media Development Authority of Singapore (IMDA) offers affordable PCs and broadband access to students and people with disabilities from low income families.

1. Gross household monthly income must not exceed \$3,400 per month or per capita monthly income must not exceed \$900 (\$1,125 if there is a permanently disabled household member) or a recipient of MOE FAS for the applicants of the PC Bundle Scheme.
2. Subsidy of 80% (cap at \$280) from DHS.

Subsidy for Enrichment Programmes

3. Subsidy of 80% (cap at \$200) for students with per capita monthly household income of \$1,000 and below. (Revised from per capita monthly household income of \$750 and below) Student to co-pay 20%.
4. Subsidy of 60% (cap at \$150) for students with per capita monthly household income of \$1,100 and below. (Revised from per capita monthly household income of \$900 and below.) Student to co-pay 40%.
5. Subsidy of 40% (cap at \$100) for students with per capita monthly household income of \$1,200 and below. (Revised from per capita monthly household income of \$1050 and below). Student to co-pay 60%.
6. Subsidy of 20% (cap at \$50) for students with per capita monthly household income of \$1,300 and below. (Revised from per capita monthly household income of \$1,200 and below.) Student to co-pay 80%.

7. Subsidy of 80% (cap at \$2,000) for students with per capita monthly household income of \$1,000 and below. Student to co-pay 20%.
8. Subsidy of 60% (cap at \$1,500) for students with per capita monthly household income of \$1,100 and below. Student to co-pay 40%.
9. Subsidy of 40% (cap at \$1,000) for students with per capita monthly household income of \$1,200 and below. Student to co-pay 60%.
10. Subsidy of 20% (cap at \$500) for students with per capita monthly household income of \$1,300 and below. Student to co-pay 80%
